# 35.A Zero Tolerance Policy

Inhumane treatment or excessive training of a horse in any manner is strictly prohibited. Both owner and rider of any horse entered in an NCHA approved or sponsored event, by said entry, consents to the implementation of any action allowed by this Zero Tolerance Policy (Rule 35.A) by either show management or judge. This includes any act which the general public would perceive to constitute inhumane treatment or excessive training of a horse. Any act of inhumane treatment, mistreatment, or intent to mistreat a horse will be dealt with in the strongest possible manner as provided for in this Standing Rule. This Zero Tolerance Policy covers acts occurring not only in the show arena, but also those occurring anywhere on the show grounds-the warm-up area, practice pen or any other location.

The "Zero Tolerance" policy encompasses all of the following acts:


1. Excessive Training: Excessive Training includes: excessive jerking; cueing; whipping; use of lip wire or similar device; slapping or hitting a horse on the head, or any other part of the body, one time or more than one time, in any manner, either with the rider's hands, reins or any other object; using a bit in such a way that a horse is caused to bleed from its mouth or face; using any object held in the rider's hand to hit a horse; or any other act which may cause trauma or injury to a horse.

2. Inhumane treatment: Inhumane Treatment is the exhibition of a lame or injured horse, or a horse that appears lame or injured, or a horse with any other health abnormality, which could thereby result in the horse's undue discomfort or distress.

3. Administration of injectable or oral medications or possession of any drug paraphernalia while in the show arena, practice arenas, alleys leading into the arenas or any other public areas of the show grounds is strictly prohibited unless administered in a life-saving situation which should only be done based on consultation with a veterinarian.


4. Any member observing activity that violates these rules should immediately report such conduct to the NCHA Executive Director and/or Show Management. Any violation of this rule may result in disciplinary action which may include fines, probation and/or suspension as provided for in the NCHA Rules.

5. Please consult the NCHA Rulebook to ensure that you are familiar with and are abiding by all NCHA rules relating to the welfare of the horse at all times, including Standing Rules 35 & 35A.

# 2025 NRR CAT KING COLE NCHA SUPER STAKES **ARENA FOOTING STUDY**


#### **OVERVIEW**

Texas A&M University reseachers will be conducting a study to evaluate arena footing characteristics and their response over time during the 2025 NRR Cat King Cole NCHA Super Stakes. Objectives of this study include:

- Quantify key arena footing characteristics using a suite of mechanical testing equipment and laboratory analysis.
- Identify the effects of competition on footing characteristics.
- Gather subjective evaluations from exhibitors and industry professionals.

#### WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

This research will be performed in three different segments, targeted towards the beginning, middle and end of the Super Stakes. During the dates of March 19th, 20th, 31st and April 1st, 9th and 10th, the John Justin Arena will be closed from 6am - 7am



and immediately following completion of each day's competition for data collection.

Testing will occur at six specific locations (depicted in the lower left corner) to access and compare high versus low impact areas. Characteristics to be identified in each location include: stiffness, hardness, penetration resistance, depth, shear strength, moisture content, and more. Small soil samples will be collected for material analysis of mechanical and index properties. Ambient temperature and humidity will be monitored, along with maintenance practices.

The equipment being used is relatively noninvasive and will not change the current state of the footing. The arena will be drug post-testing to ensure a smooth, and fair competition surface.

#### OUTCOMES

This study will contribute to a better understanding of how arena footing characteristics change throughout an event, and how various factors influence these developments. It will have practical implications for improving arena management practices and enhancing the welfare of cutting horses. While this research may not provide all of the answers regarding optimal ground conditions, it serves as a foundational step to addressing these questions.

#### RULES

- Payment due upon arrival
- Spaces in North Red Lot and Yellow Lot D include 30/50-amp power, water and sewer; Lot 1 includes water and electric only
- There are no drive-through spaces. (No connected trailers in back-to-back spaces.)
- Cash or Checks payable to **City of Fort Worth** at Will Rogers, or **Fort Worth Convention Center** at the convention center (no two-party checks allowed)
- Mastercard, Visa, Discover and American Express credit cards are accepted
- No Reservations accepted
- Rent accepted only when living quarters are present
- Some outlets are in groups of four and eight, so some RVs may be parked three or four RV lengths from outlets
- RV owners responsible for bringing own extension cords, hoses and supplies
- Electrical adapters are available through Will Rogers for \$20 per adapter
- No RV parking will be allowed in unmarked spaces or between barns
