RULE CHANGE: PROHIBITED MEDICATION RULE CHANGE

BEGINNING: 2021 NCHA POINT YEAR

PLEASE BE AWARE AND MAKE YOUR CLIENTS AWARE OF THE FOLLOWING CHANGE:

USE OF PROHIBITED MEDICATION

- (1) For a first offense resulting from the use of a prohibited substance, forfeiture of any winnings from the show, a fine in the range of \$2,500 - \$5,000, loss of any titles and awards won at the show;
- (2) For a second offense resulting from the use of a prohibited substance, forfeiture of any winnings from the show, a fine in the range of \$5,000 - \$10,000, loss of any titles and awards won at the show and a one-year membership suspension;
- (3) For a third offense resulting from the use of a prohibited substance, forfeiture of any winnings from the show, a fine in the range of \$10,000 - \$15,000, loss of any titles and awards won at the show, membership suspension of at least 2 years.

**The foregoing disciplinary action applies to each "Responsible Person" as defined in NCHA rules
